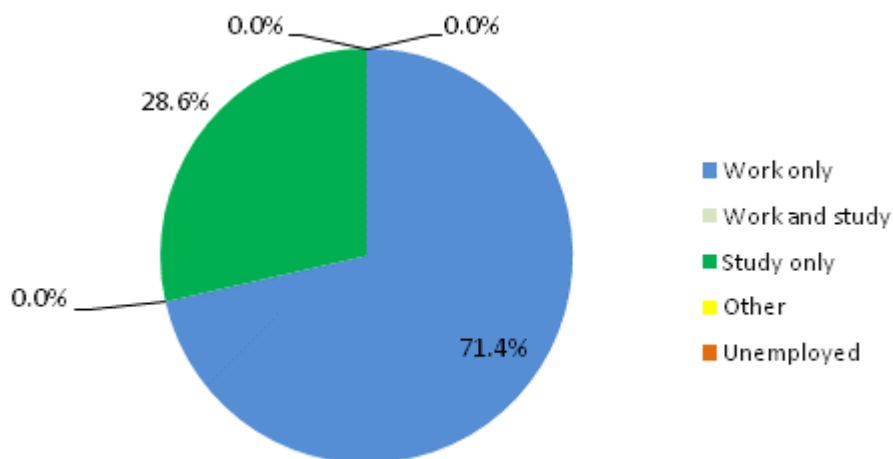


# Career destinations

### Knowledge and skills

Graduates understand the theory and principles of computing including technical and developmental issues. They focus on software, networking, the interface of humans with computers and web development, all highly significant to business users, and have skills in using a range of tools and techniques. This includes practical experience in building computer systems.

### Career opportunities

Opportunities include applications development, technical support, database administration, information systems management, web development, software engineering and systems analysis. Employment can be with large I.T. companies, in-house teams, consultancies or self employment. Opportunities exist within local and central government, finance, manufacturing, telecommunications, retail, health, transport and defence. Other linked possibilities are technical sales, training and technical authorship.

Graduates wishing to teach need to take a professional qualification. The most common route is via a one year post-graduate course but there are alternatives including a mix of work and training in accredited institutions.

The transferable skills developed include communication, numeracy, team working and logical thinking, which are valued by virtually all employers and open up further options.
