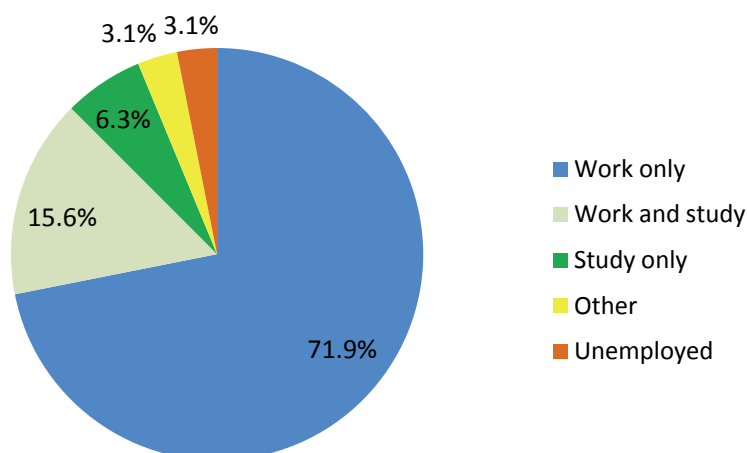

Knowledge and skills

Graduates gain knowledge of crime, including the nature of the justice system, ethical issues, the social context for criminal activity and specific contemporary concerns such as youth, substance abuse and terrorism. Students also gain a wide range of skills such as research methods, critical analysis and interpretation of information, communication (including the ability to present and debate complex ideas), team working and the ability to negotiate and lead in a group situation.

Career opportunities

An understanding of law, politics and psychology support entry to a range of public sector careers, such as the police, prison service, probation, immigration and customs and excise, and in the private sector in security, investigation and crime prevention. Graduates' skills can also be used to enter graduate-level roles not necessarily directly related to criminology, such as youth work, public and commercial administration and charity work.
