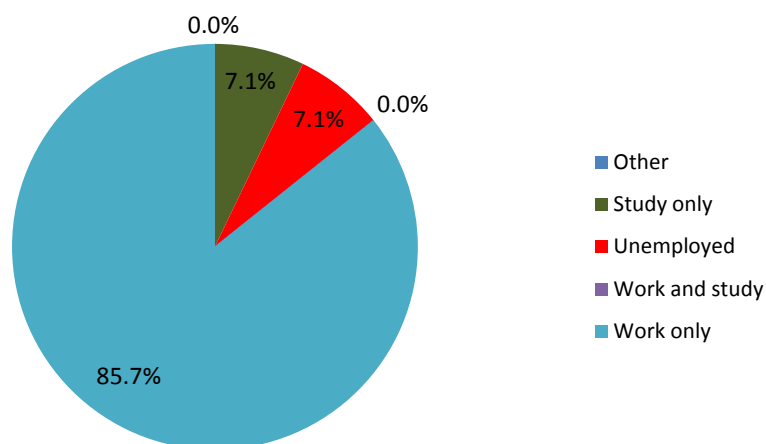

Knowledge and skills

In addition to knowledge about the nature and formation of the physical environment and the impact of humans on it, graduates acquire a wide range of skills. These include undertaking field work, collecting and analysing information, research and report writing. They also develop awareness of moral and ethical issues.

Graduates have additional transferable skills such as problem-solving, decision-making, numeracy, use of I.T., teamworking, communication, discussion and presentation. These are sought by virtually all employers opening up further career options including business, law and finance.

Career opportunities

Related employment may be in monitoring/regulatory areas, research, consultancy, GIS systems, planning and surveying. Employers include local government, environmental consultancies, environmental protection agencies, utilities, charities, information systems organisations, transport, tourism and the civil service.

To become a teacher the usual route is to take a one year post graduate course but there are other routes.
