Knowledge and skills

Students on this degree will be taught the practical and technical skills to make programmes. They will also gain transferable skills such as research, analysis, communication and teamwork, all of which are valued in the graduate labour market.

Accredited by Skillset (the Sector Skills Council for the Creative Media) as part of the University's Skillset Media Academy, a national centre of excellence in media education.

Career opportunities

This degree aims to produce graduates who will go on to work primarily in the television industry. Further opportunities might exist in film, facilities or in-house media. Typically graduates entering media begin by working in trainee, assistant and runner roles. In the longer term graduates might aim to find positions in production, post-production, directing and research. Most often they will work on a freelance basis.
