

## ✓ Checklist

Please ensure you have made the following arrangements before entering the UK to study.

- Ensure that you have sufficient finances to cover your tuition fees, accommodation and living costs during your study period in the UK.
- All incomers to EU countries (and EU nationals leaving EU countries) will be required to declare if they have over €10,000 or its equivalent in other currencies (equivalent approximately £9,300) regardless of the payment methods that you use.
- Ensure that you have a valid passport, and if you require a student visa that you have followed the new immigration procedures.
- Complete the Tuition Fees form and make arrangements for the payment of your fees with Student Accounts.
- Arrange your accommodation in the UK in advance of travelling.
- Ensure that you have the original copies of your examination certificates and English language results. You will be asked to produce these at enrolment. You must also have proof of identity (birth certificate, passport, national identity card or driving licence).
- If you are an exchange student, remember to bring your offer letter and Learning Agreement.
- If you are a national from the European Economic Area (EEA) and you are coming to study for less than six months you will need to complete the E128 forms in your own country. This only covers you for emergency health treatment via the National Health Service. You are therefore advised to make sure that, before you travel, you take out additional health insurance. It is not sufficient to take out standard holiday insurance as this may be invalidated on the basis that you are travelling abroad to study, not on holiday.
- If you are a non-EEA national and you are coming to study for less than six months, do you have adequate medical insurance to cover your period of stay in the UK?
- If you have learning difficulties such as dyslexia, please bring your assessment report from an educational psychologist.
- Bring any relevant paperwork relating to your course of study, accommodation agreement, payment of fees, and so on.
