It is this questioning of 'norms' that makes Media and Fashion Styling an exciting department to study and work within, and I am reminded when looking at the students' work this year of Virginia Woolf's great quote: 'Vain trifles as they seem, clothes have, they say, more important offices than to merely keep us warm. They change our view of the world and the world's view of us.'
