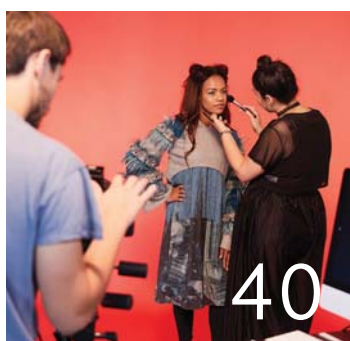
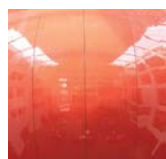

A DIGITAL CINEMA WITH DOLBY ATMOS AUDIO

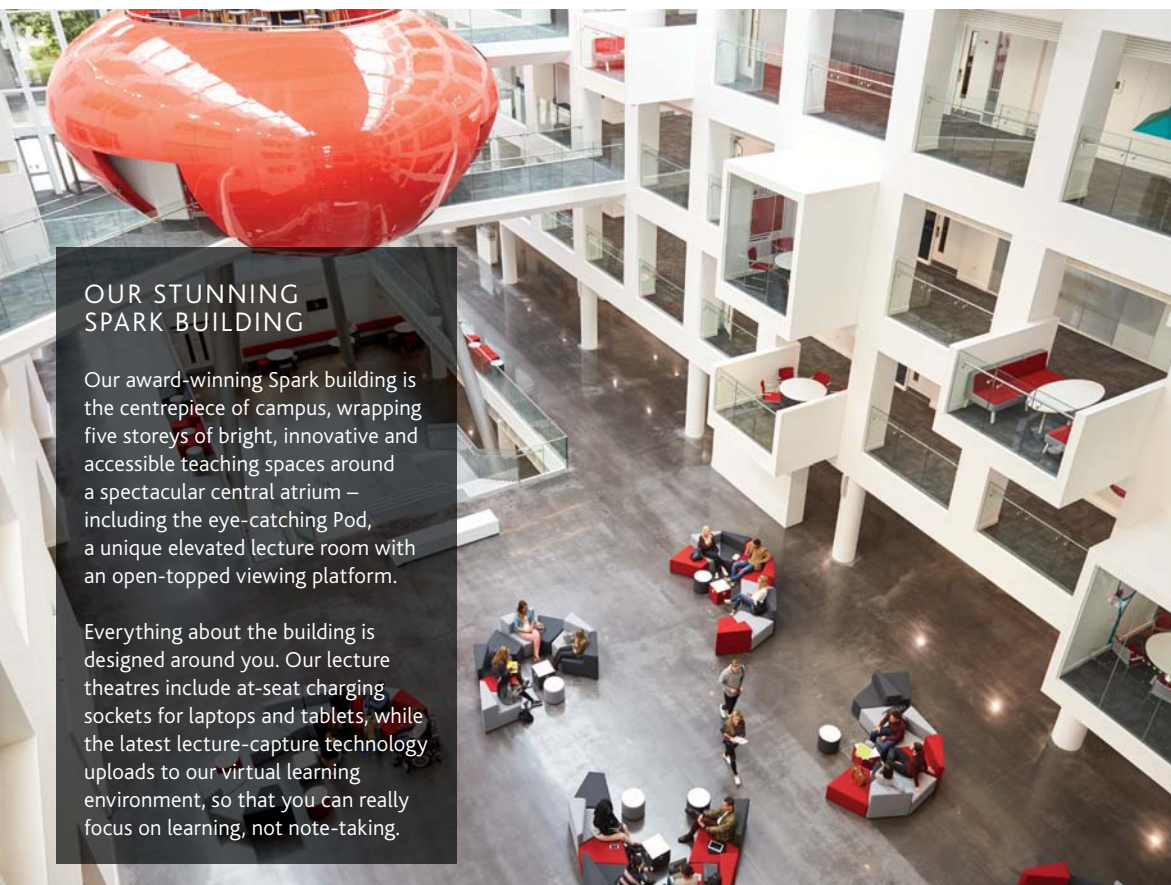
Our student-run cinema makes us one of just a handful of universities worldwide with Dolby Atmos encoding capabilities.

Southampton High Street brings you all the familiar names, while Westquay shopping centre is one of the biggest in the country, with over 150 shops and a huge range of food choices.

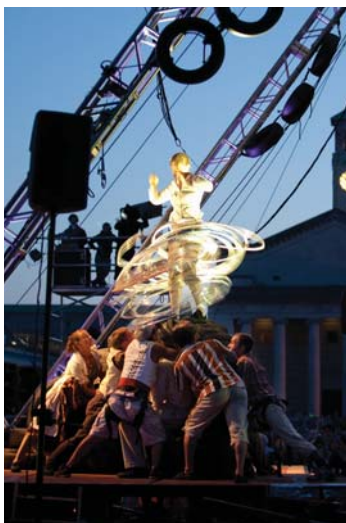

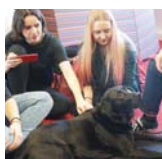
EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES

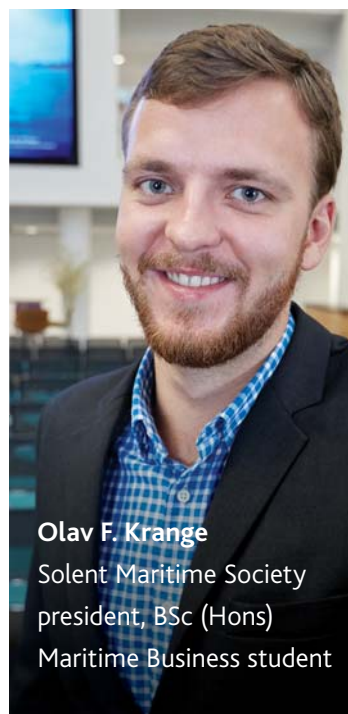

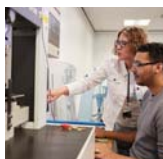

OUR STUDENT RESIDENCES

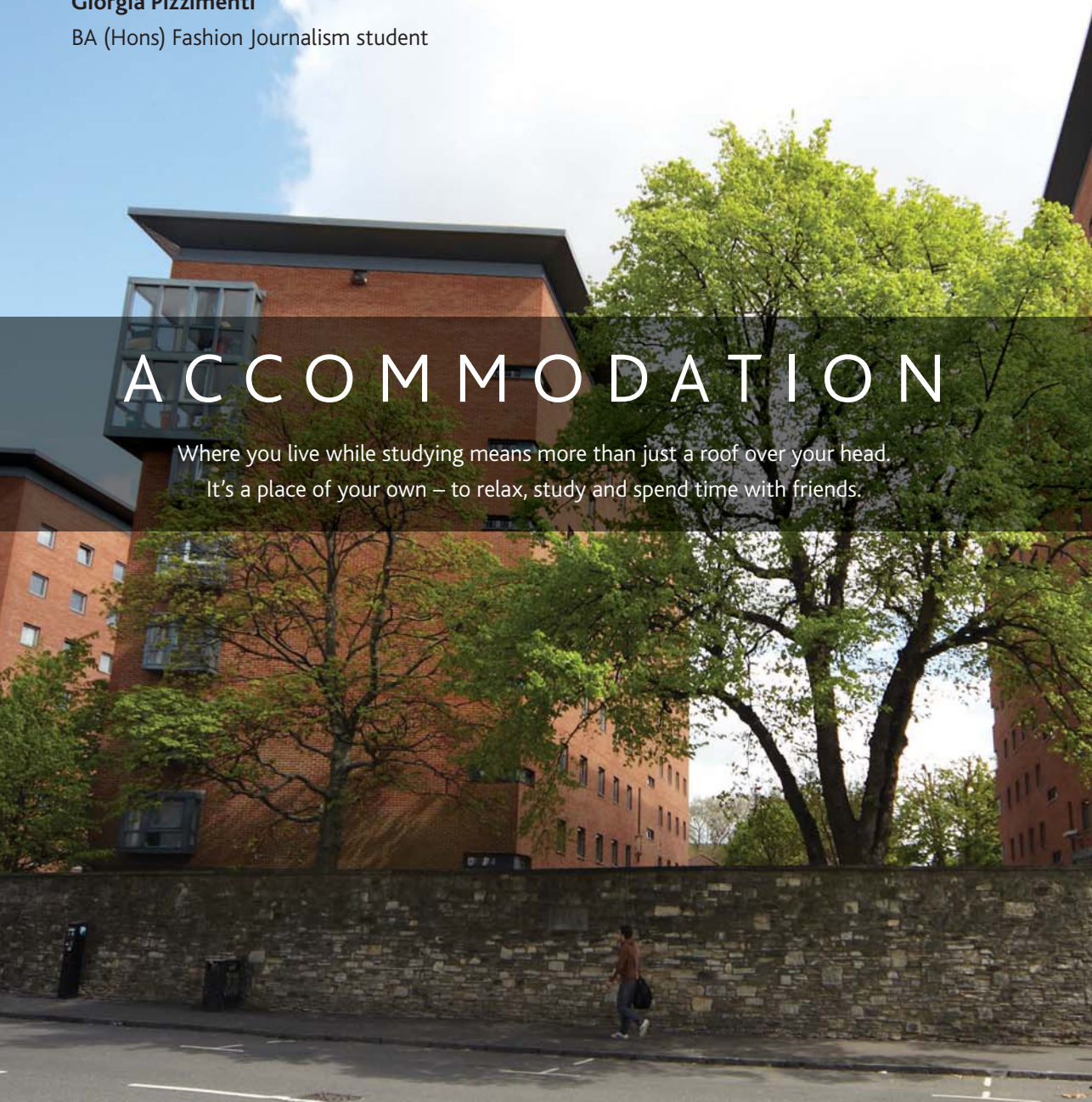
Our seven student residences hold more than 2,300 fantastic study-bedrooms, all within walking distance of the main Solent campus. They're a great way to make new friends in your first year, and there's a great sense of student community.

Plus it's only a short walk into town, so they're perfect for getting to know Southampton.

ACCOMMODATION

Where you live while studying means more than just a roof over your head.

It's a place of your own – to relax, study and spend time with friends.





WHAT YOU GET

Rooms vary in price, but we have something for everyone's needs. As well as a fully furnished study-bedroom, you get:

- Up to 60Mb WiFi access in each study-bedroom.
- All utility bills included.
- Access to a well-equipped shared kitchen.
- Personal contents insurance.
- Social spaces with Sky TV and games consoles.
- Residence management team available 24 hours a day.
- Adapted and accessible rooms for students with disabilities and special needs.

Car parking is available at each residence at an additional cost.

SAFE AND SUPPORTED

Help is never far away if you need it. All of our residences have 24/7 support from our dedicated on-site residence teams. Every entrance, study-bedroom and kitchen area is also designed so that only residents and their guests can enter. And of course, all of our residences meet fire safety regulations and the government-approved code of practice for the management of student housing.

ACCESSIBLE TO ALL

For students with disabilities or special needs, we can provide a range of support and facilities. Free parking is available for blue badge holders, both at the residences and on campus.

And we have purpose-built ground-floor rooms with hoists for wheelchair users and students with mobility difficulties. Larger rooms are also available for students who need extra space for essential equipment, including medical fridges in bedrooms, and further adaptations can be made following an occupational therapist's assessment.

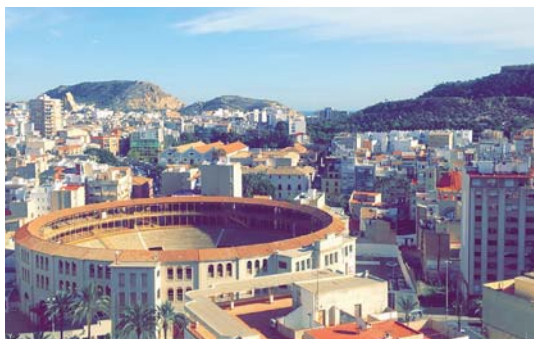

Enhance your career and broaden your horizons – spend part of your degree working abroad, or study at one of our international partner universities.





Studying or working abroad is an incredible experience, opening up potential opportunities and giving you a competitive edge when you graduate.

You don't need to speak another language, but there is support available if you would like to strengthen your language skills.

Depending on your course and the country you would like to visit, we offer two main exchange paths:

ERASMUS+

The European Union's Erasmus+ is a funded programme designed to encourage young people like you to build connections and creativity throughout the EU.

You can study with a fantastic range of universities across Europe, for anything between three months and a whole academic year, and your time abroad contributes towards your final grade.

We also hold the Extended Charter for Higher Education (ECHE), which gives you an even broader range of options under Erasmus+.

And work placements abroad are also possible, from two months to a full year.

INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE

Looking outside the EU, our international exchange programme has a growing number of partnerships with international universities across the globe.

Higher and degree apprenticeships offer the best of both worlds – you'll learn from your employer's expertise, developing the skills, knowledge and working habits of a practising professional, and graduate with an industry-accredited academic qualification such as an HNC, HND, degree or master's.

Studying in this way also means no student loan and zero tuition fees, as your course is paid for by your employer. And you'll earn while you learn, with a minimum wage of £3.50 per hour – although many employers pay more.

FUNDING

Your tuition fees are paid jointly by the employer and the government. Recent government announcements have also confirmed funding for higher education that sits within an approved higher or degree apprenticeship programme. FEES AND FINANCIAL SUPPORT

As an undergraduate student, you'll have two main types of expenses
– tuition fees and your living costs.





Your tuition fee status is determined by your nationality and the country where you normally live. If you're from the UK or an EU country, you can access tuition fee loans and maintenance loans (which you have to pay back), and grants and bursaries (which you don't).

On some courses you will also need to pay for field visits and buy specialist equipment – you can find these costs on our course pages.

TUITION FEES

Tuition fees for full-time 2018/2019 undergraduate students from the UK (including the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man) and the EU were £9,250 per year. For the latest information, visit www.solent.ac.uk/funding

UK and EU students don't need to pay tuition fees up-front – you can apply for a loan to cover these.

TUITION FEE LOANS

Eligible students from England and the EU can apply for a loan to cover tuition fees. If you are from England, this loan doesn't depend on your household income and is paid direct to the University on your behalf.

You only need to start paying this loan back when you are earning more than £25,000.

MAINTENANCE LOANS

If you are from England and will be a full-time student, you can also apply for a loan to support you while you study, helping cover food, accommodation and other costs. The loan is paid into your bank account in three instalments, at the beginning of each academic term.

The amount available depends on:

- Where you live while studying.
- Your assessed family income (known as 'means-tested').
- Your underlying entitlement to state benefits (for example, lone parents and disabled students).

Students who have an entitlement to benefits can receive further financial support from the government, such as the Adult Dependents' Grant, the Parents' Learning Allowance and the Childcare Grant.

If you're from Wales, Scotland or Northern Ireland, you will need to contact your own funding body for details about support available towards living costs if you decide to study in England.

"University prepares you in a way you will probably never know. New academic skills, life lessons and opportunities for personal development are some of the key points.

Prior to leaving university I had lined up a group marketing manager's role at a large recruitment and training group for the logistics and transport sector. After four months in the role, I decided that the role simply wasn't challenging, interesting or enjoyable enough for me. Although the company ethos was fantastic, it simply didn't deliver what I was looking to gain out of a role. I then started to think about what life could be like running my own business.

I pitched an idea to my then boss, which was that I could do the current role on a freelance or self-employed basis for two days per week, and that would provide me with three days in the week to self-generate other new business. He accepted that offer and ThinkEngine was born!

After spending my first couple of days cold-calling prospects, I found opportunities coming along which then allowed me to grow my digital marketing business.

Since that day, the business has gone from strength to strength, working with a fantastic range of clients from a wide range of industry sectors.

I have three key career highlights so far; a first-class business management degree is definitely one of those. To work alongside my fantastic group of friends made it even better, and the results for everyone made the whole journey worthwhile.

I believe that managing to run a small business and growing year on year is a key highlight. Unless they have started a start-up business, not many people understand the hard work, pressures and sacrifices one has to make. To some people this may not be a highlight or achievement, but in my eyes, it should be. More appreciation should be given to entrepreneurs who can build a business, and especially those businesses which reach the over-two-years stage. That is a real achievement, in my humble opinion.

Another key highlight is being selected as a finalist for the Best of Britain Awards 2017. ThinkEngine was shortlisted in the final four against an extremely competitive pool of 650+ UK companies. The award aims to reward small businesses which are going about business in the right way, and doing all they can to build opportunities for their team."

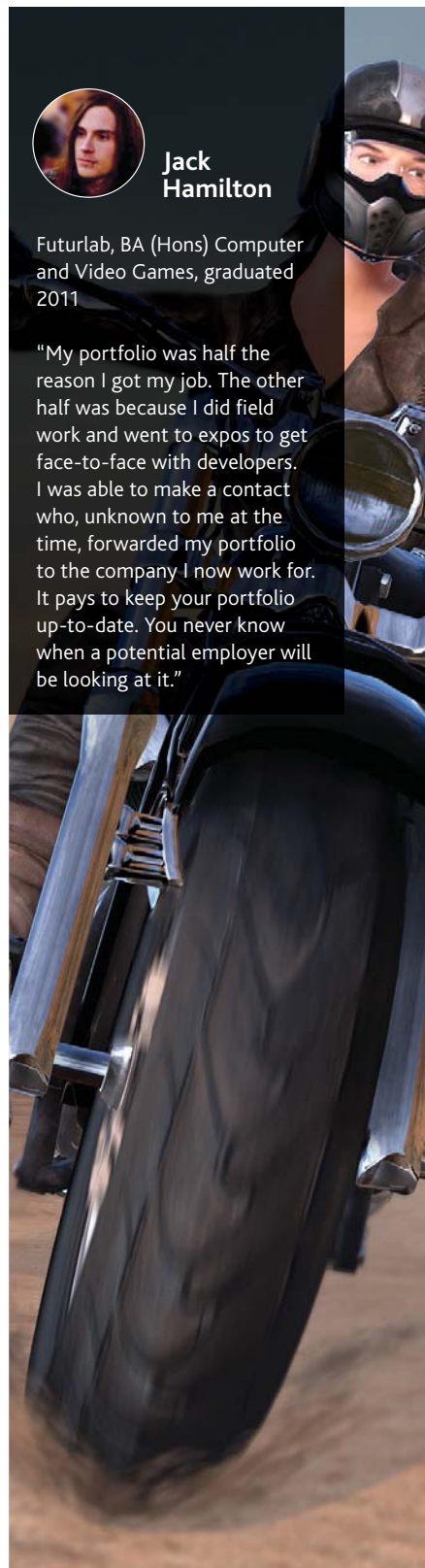

My favourite memory from Solent has to be raising the trophy for 'Best Film' at the annual Harbour Lights screening event (where graduates' animation films are screened for students and industry professionals alike) – that amazing feeling of pride completely validated three sleepless years of pushing my learning to the limit.

I have been working within the core of the post-production industry for 13 years now at Absolute Post, in the

heart of Soho. Starting as a runner, I trained and progressed my career to the point where I am supervising teams of super talented artists, producing amazing results together, creating pretty pictures which I am very proud of.

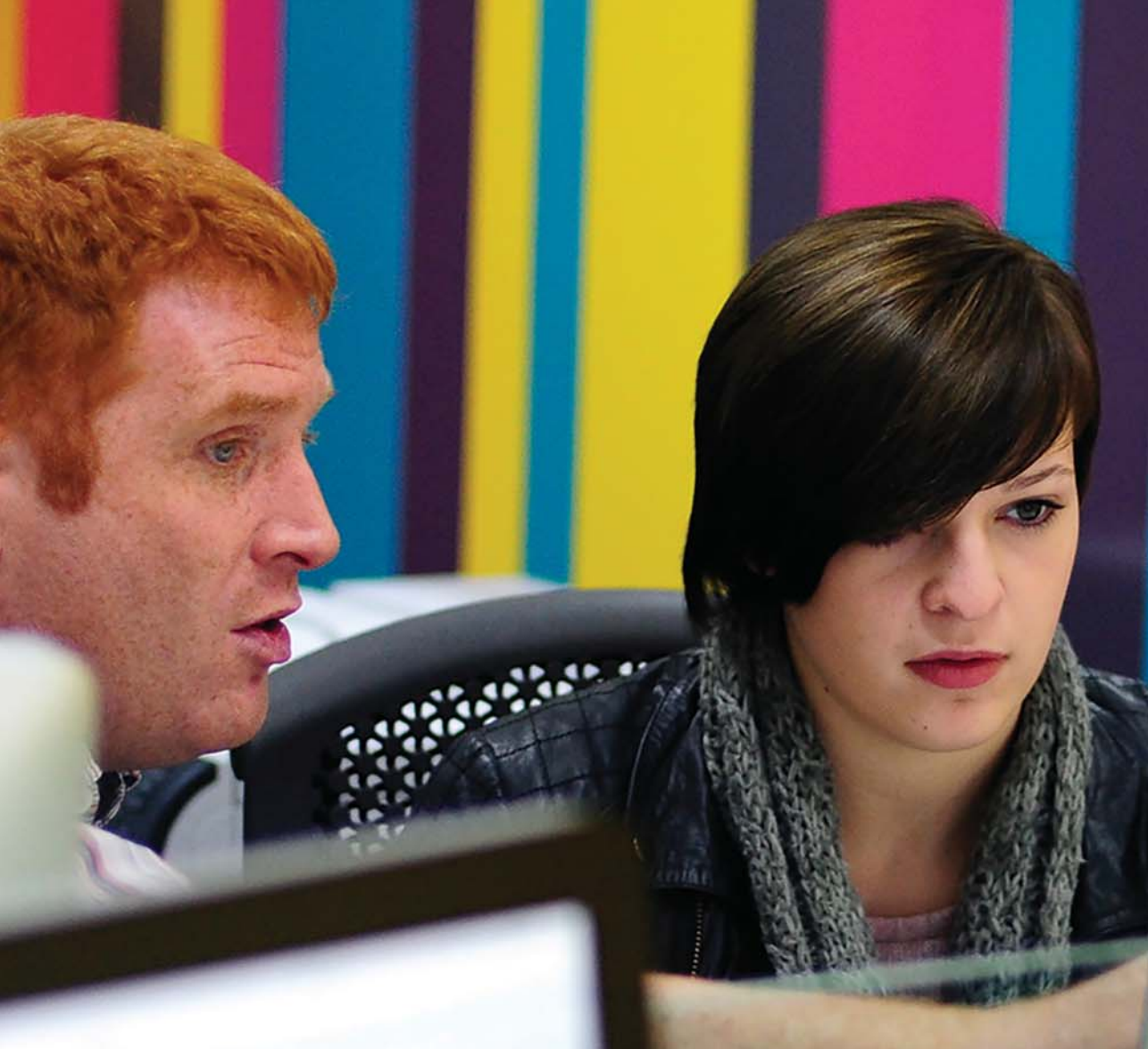
I recently relocated my family out to the beautiful countryside of north Wales. I have my own office here which I use to connect remotely to Absolute's server and work as if I was still in London. A typical working day involves a lot of learning and serious head-down 3D VFX work time, interspersed with phone calls, e-mails and lunchtime walks surrounded by beautiful scenery.

A few career highlights for me have been outstanding in both their challenges and rewards. Working on a huge viral 'TED 2023' film used to

promote Ridley Scott's *Prometheus* movie was an amazing experience, as was working on a recent high-profile short film directed by Baz Luhrmann. The work I am most proud of, though, is the unicorn-filled piece we created for a 'First Utility' commercial a few years ago, which I was lucky enough to be CG supervisor on.

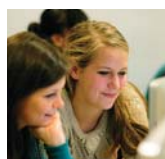
Advice I'd give to anyone wanting to work in animation is to stick at it. It will get harder before it gets easier, but the results will be worth it. I get paid to make unicorns and weird creatures come to life – that could be you (if you like that sort of thing). "I am currently in my third year. There is a lot less time actually spent in seminars and lectures than the first and second years, which is perfect for me. There is a lot of reading and discussion: you are encouraged to share your views, no matter how outlandish or farfetched you may think they are. You are encouraged to push yourself and to learn new ways of reading literature, and typically discuss topics such as feminism, sexuality and existentialism, to name a few.

The level of freedom is a blessing and a curse, depending on the kind of worker you are. For me, I thrive on the level of independence, but I am also a very last-minute worker. It can be difficult to motivate yourself, but there's a lot of time outside of the classroom to dedicate to reading and research, and also to pursue projects outside of university.

I've always had a deep dislike of Shakespeare since secondary school. I believe that schools don't teach Shakespeare efficiently enough, to say the least, and I wasn't expecting anything different. Now, I have an awakened appreciation of him as I never saw myself enjoying Shakespeare's work. I've since learned to read and study literature outside of predisposed bias and prejudice.



This course is for you if you value independence and individuality."

On the media side of the course I've learned that I love recording and designing sound, and about various ways to practise and experiment with that.

My Solent highlight so far is putting together *On The Water* through Solent Creatives, an anthology of poetry, prose and everything in between. I loved the entire process and I discovered I had a passion for publishing.

My course has helped me gain confidence and find my voice, think differently and experiment in terms of creative writing and expression. I'm a spoken-word poet and I like to perform and publish poetry. This course has encouraged me to do that.

On the media side of the course I have learned how to use software like InDesign (which I have used to create zines) as well as developed my skills in Photoshop, Premiere Pro and Lightroom. Media courses at Solent are very practical and hands-on.

I believe working in the radio and photography studios and using the equipment (which can also be hired out for personal use) are taken for granted: you won't be able to use the work spaces and equipment once you've graduated."

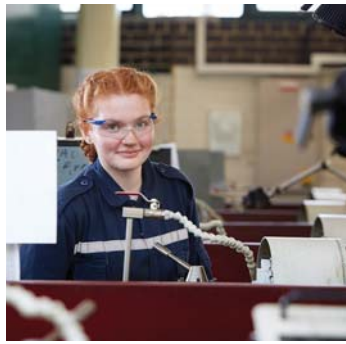

This meant that everyone graduated with a thorough understanding of the industry and how to succeed in finding a job.

I knew that getting work experience while studying was going to be vital in securing a job after university, so I worked as a junior consultant in a PR agency in Portsmouth during my second year, where I worked with some big clients such as the Dutch airline, KLM. This really paid off as not only did I enter third year with a really good understanding of the industry which I could apply to my learning, but it also gave me the luxury of being able to focus on my studies without having to worry about getting experience.

Once my dissertation was handed in I started to apply to agencies that appealed to me and quite quickly secured a job as an account executive in a PR and marketing agency in Newbury."

"After graduating, I worked at Solent Productions for a little over a year, filming and editing corporate work for companies including B&Q and the NHS. I then started to work regularly with a company that specialises in filming cycling, and through this I learnt Motocam. It's a skill that not many people can master, and not many people enjoy. But I love it. I am at my happiest when stood up on the back of a motorcycle racing down a mountain at 60mph!

Since training, I have spent years developing the skill, filming races all over the world in completely contrasting conditions: snow at the Tour of Alberta in Canada and scorching 45-degree heat at the Tour of Utah in the United States. I also work on live corporate and sporting events as a vision mixer director, and I edit frequently throughout the year. I love the variation that my career offers – it keeps me on my toes!

A tip I'd give to someone wanting to get into this industry, is that hard work doesn't go unnoticed. The film and television industries are notoriously difficult to get into and, in my experience, those starting at the bottom of the ladder who are hardworking, diligent and talented, don't stay there for long."

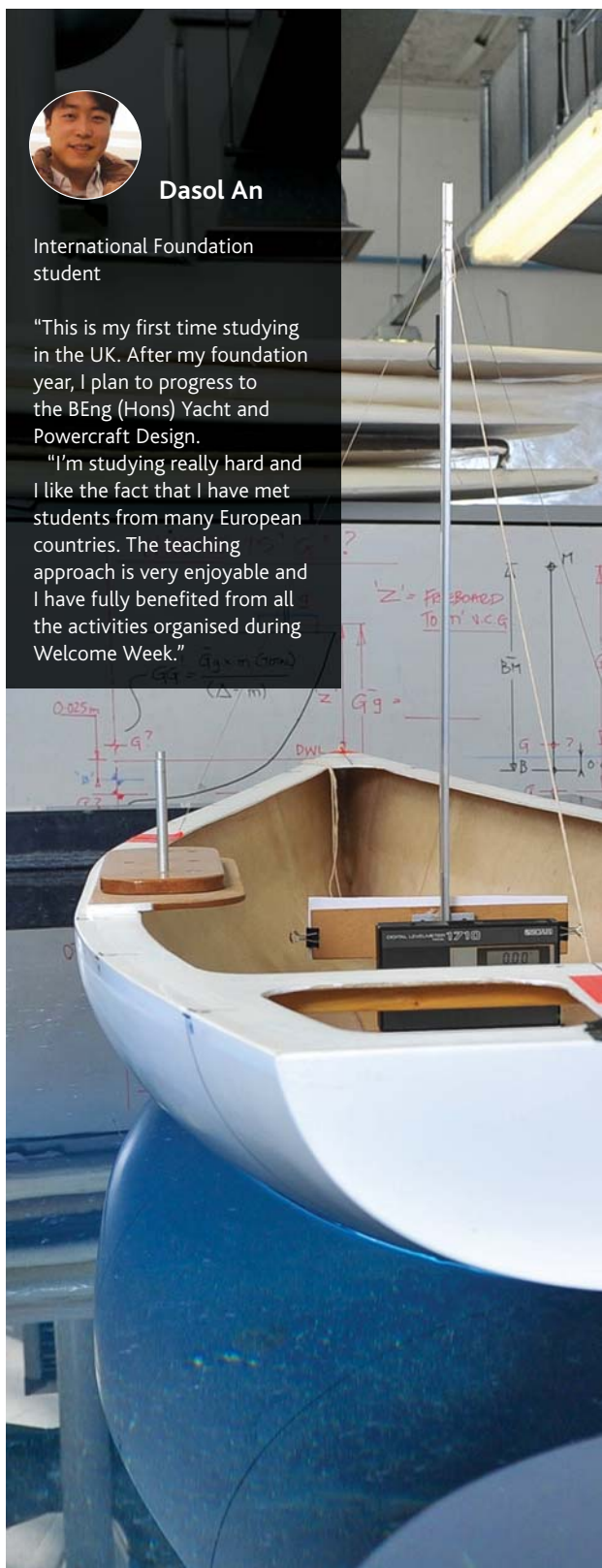

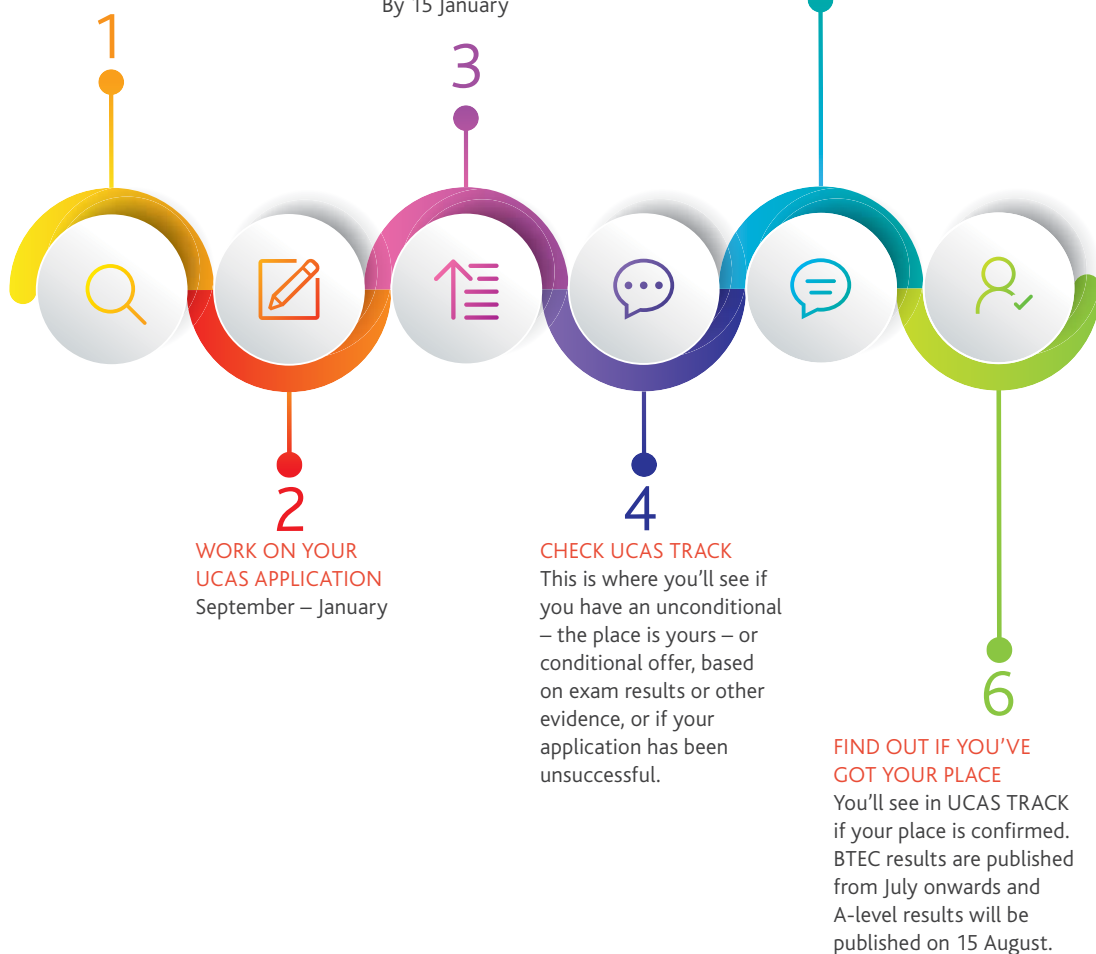

Solent University is committed to enabling students from all kinds of background to have access to higher education. Students enter our courses through a wide range of educational routes, and each application is considered on its own merits.

UCAS TARIFF POINTS

Like most universities, we use the UCAS tariff points system to show the total number of points our courses require. Your UCAS points can come from a variety of recognised qualifications, such as:

ALTERNATIVE ENTRY

We encourage applications from students who may not normally consider going to university, who might not have achieved their full potential at school or college, or who don't have traditional qualifications but are able to demonstrate aptitude, enthusiasm and motivation through interview and/or a portfolio viewing.

Applicants aged 21 and over may be considered based on relevant experience.

Some courses may allow direct entry into the second or third years, such as for holders of an HND or HNC in an appropriate subject.

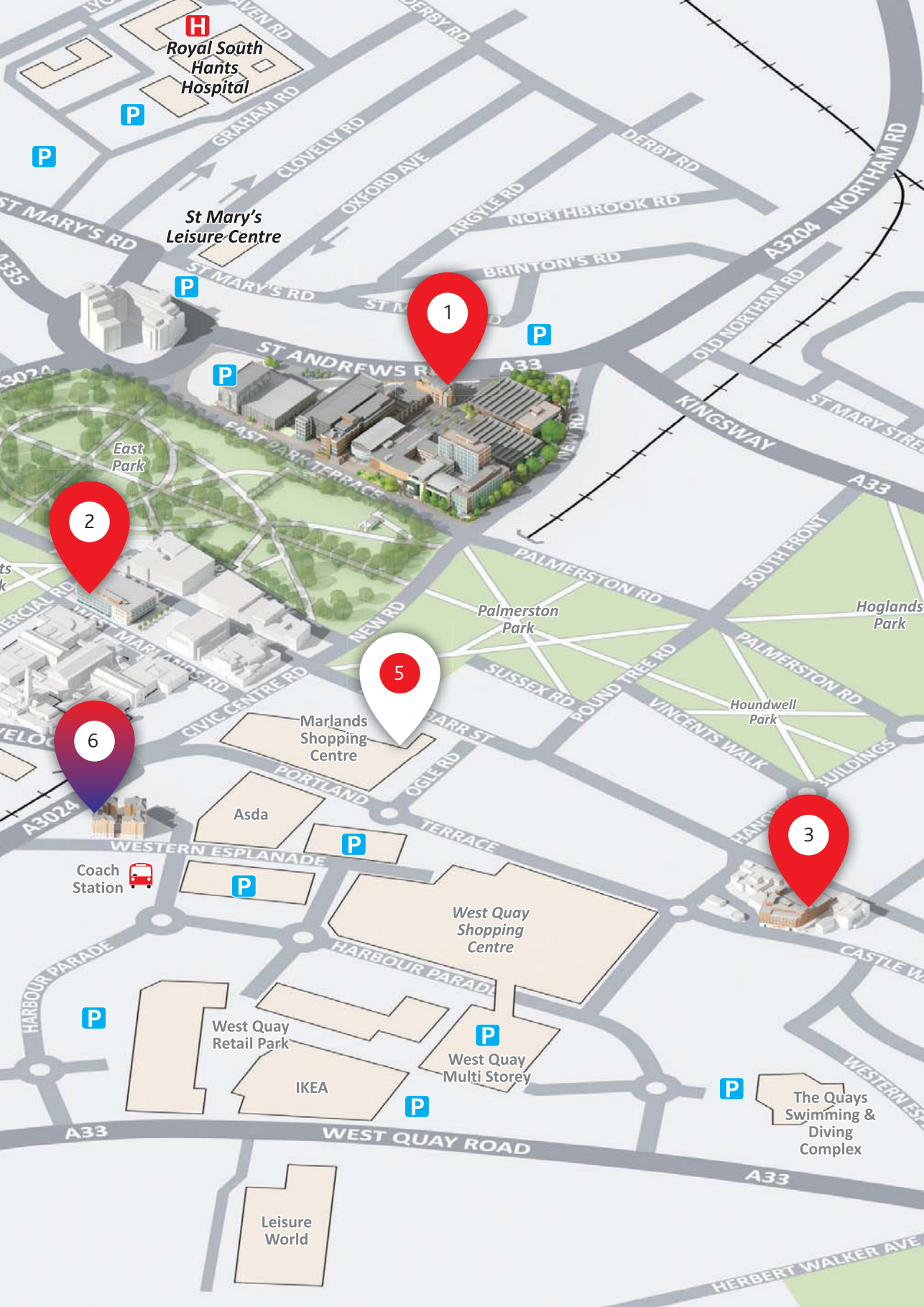

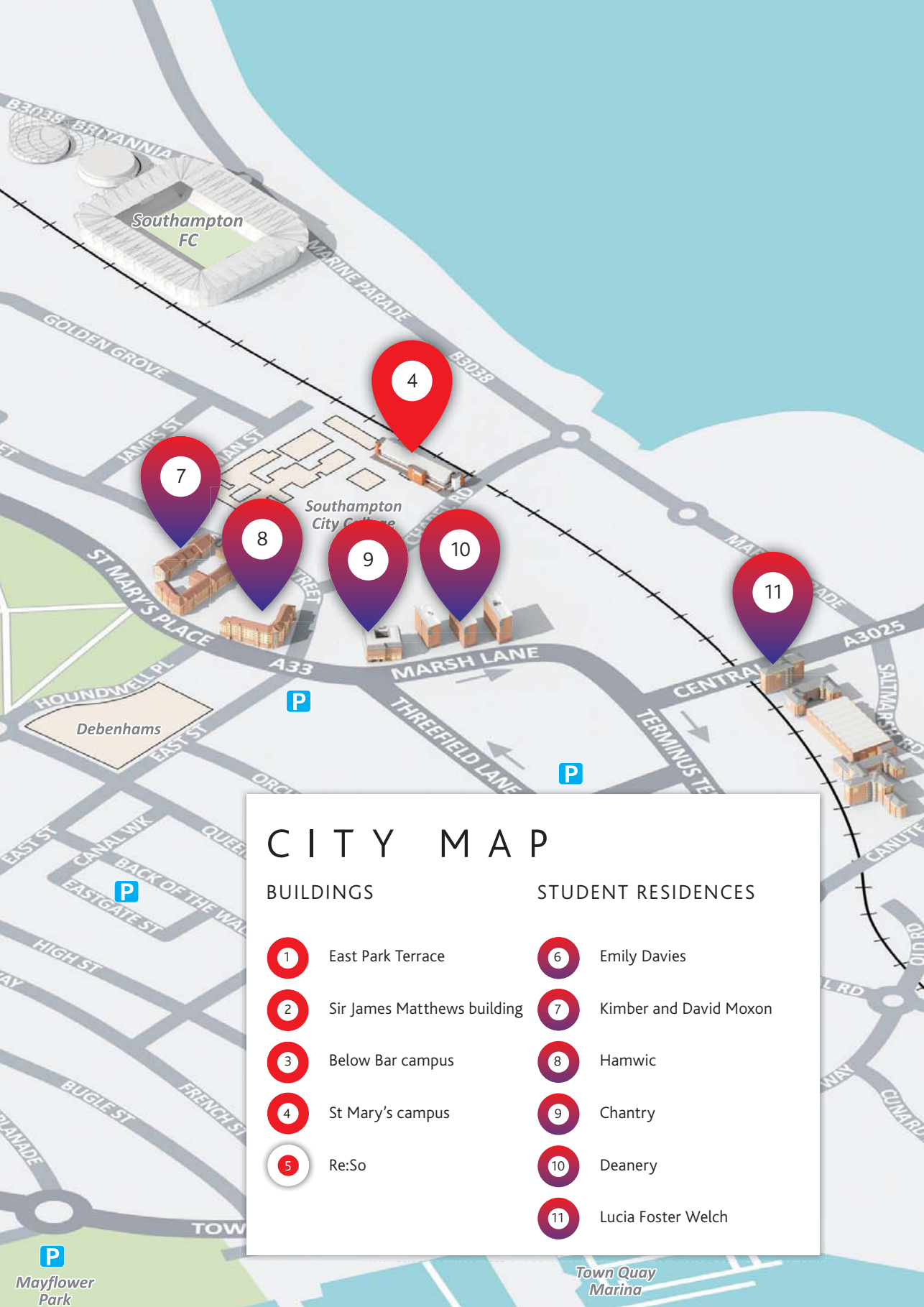

From London, take the regular train service from London Waterloo station.

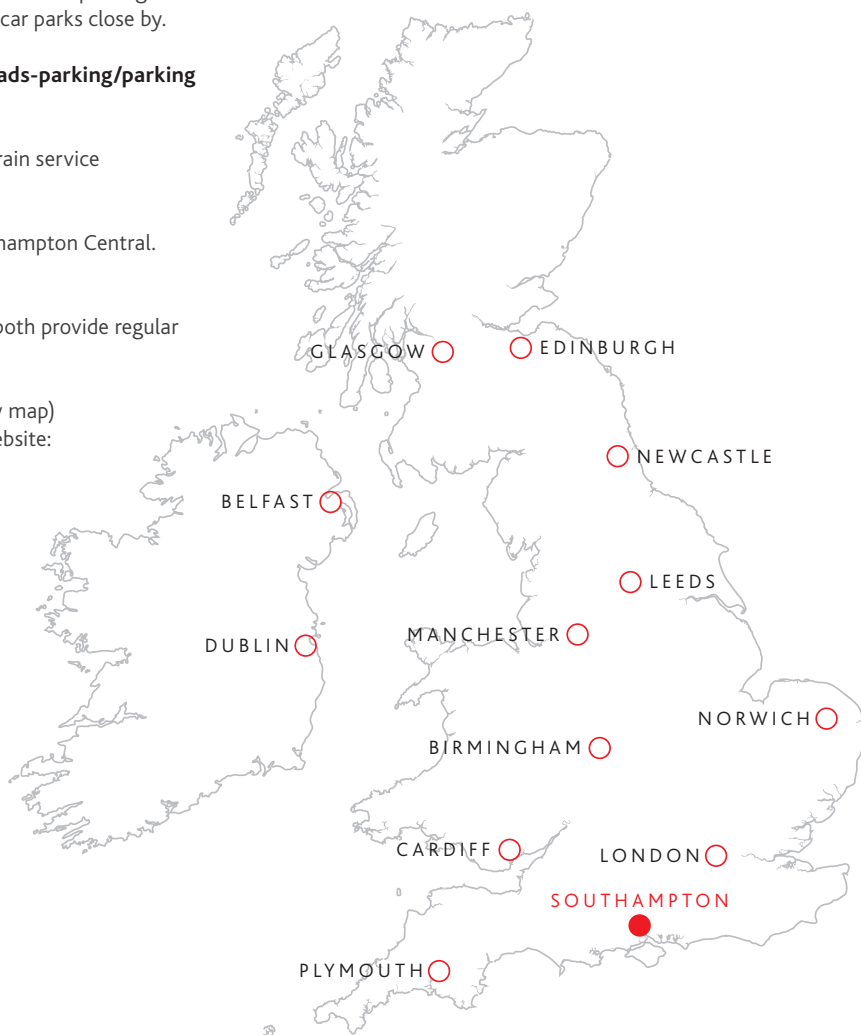
The closest train station is Southampton Central.
