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



Professional actor

BA (Hons) Acting and Performance, 2018

When and where did you start your professional career as a performer?

It was 2018 and my final project at Solent was at The Nuffield Southampton Theatre in a production of *Bonnie and Clyde* by Adam Peck. During the performance I received a message from a producer who had seen me in the show. He asked if I would audition for a new, all-male adaptation of *Romeo and Juliet* which was going to be performed at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival, and I was offered the part of Romeo!

After my London/Southampton showcase I was approached by a director who was about to tour a play about the First World War, funded by Arts Council England and the British Legion. He invited me to audition, I got the part and had two professional jobs lined up before I graduated!

What have you been up to since graduating?

I performed Romeo to a sell-out audience in Edinburgh. While there, I was approached by a director who was casting a new puppetry play that would be going on tour. This was an amazing experience as I got to build and refine my puppetry skills and learn more about Southampton's history, as the play was based on a real soldier from Southampton who fought in the First World War. I was also cast in *Out Of Control* which toured around schools and colleges and told the real stories of young people in abusive and coercive relationships.

In 2019 I reprised my role as Romeo for a UK tour, before returning to the Edinburgh Fringe Festival. At the same time, I worked on a puppetry show called *Looking Down on Me* which focused on teaching children about grief and bereavement. This was an incredible experience and was the second show that took me to the Edinburgh Fringe Festival.

I was also awarded a start-up fund to develop a play I have been writing called *Won't Fade Away*, which tells the real-life story of a couple and their experience with dementia.

Currently, I'm in rehearsal for an adaptation of A Tale of Two Cities by Charles Dickens in Hong Kong.

What has been your career highlight to date? Performing in *Blighty One*. I played a soldier called Bernie who begins suffering from PTSD. There is a beautiful monologue in which Bernie mutters "I just want to go home ..." seconds before he is shot dead. A few weeks after the show I bumped into one of the teachers who told me that over two thirds of her class had written about me and my performance for an assignment – it made me realise how lucky I am to inspire people of all ages.

How did Solent help prepare you for a career as a performer?

I got to try new things, escape my comfort zone and make errors. It allowed me to put together a wealth of skills to take into the industry. I was gifted a vast bank of knowledge from lecturers. I also learnt how to conduct myself in rehearsals, and left with a work ethic that gets me back into the audition room time and again.

What advice would you give to others wanting to follow in your footsteps?

Believe in yourself. Your career starts on day one of your training, so take it seriously, because it will prepare you for the real world.

Musical Theatre



BA (Hons) Musical Theatre, student

Why did you decide to study at Solent?
I picked Solent because the open day really impressed me and stood out among other universities because of how informative it was. You could tell they had put a lot of effort into it (other universities used a very boring PowerPoint as their virtual open day, which did not appeal at all!), and the course suited me the best with what I intend to work in after university – being close to cruise ship lines.

What's the best thing about the lecturers on your course?

The best thing about my course lecturers is how fun they make every single lesson – I am never sitting down bored! I trust my lecturers' knowledge from their own experience in the industry, and they are so friendly that I am never afraid to ask questions. The performance industry can be very daunting, but they share their own audition and training experiences with us to help – as well as organising frequent trips and guest speakers to extend our connections and understanding of our course.

How are your studies helping you prepare for your future career?

Each of the modules we do has different aspects that are useful and necessary for the industry. For example, to name just a couple, this year we have Performance Techniques which focuses on specific dance and singing techniques needed for auditions and shows, plus another module called Live Brief in which we devise our own 30-minute show for children aged 9 to 12; then next semester we have our big show. I feel that, through each module, I am learning how to succeed in all three disciplines because of how many contact hours we receive, and we are very lucky to have so many.

How is life as a student in Southampton?

I like living in Southampton because it is a very student-orientated city – everything is so close by. It has every shop and restaurant/cafe you could possibly need, as well as fun aspects such as the cinema and bowling alley – not to mention several dessert places open late in the evening! In general the city is a great space to be in because of its combination of busy shops and green parks. The nightlife is also another reason why I chose Solent!



How did university prepare you for your career?

University prepared me for my career by helping me refine my skills and discover which path within digital music I wanted to take.

Favourite Solent memory?

My favourite Solent memory was in the second year, performing with Adam Long and Tom Freeth for the Live Performance unit. It helped solidify a friendship that has continued after Solent.

Tell us a little about your career story so far. The visual media units on the BA (Hons) Digital Music course made me realise that I enjoy creating music for films. This has led to freelance opportunities which I am continuing to work on.

What's been your career highlight?

My career highlight so far was working with a large UK company to create music for their online media campaign.

Tell us about what you are doing now and what it involves – a typical working day.

I am now creating music for digital media in a freelance environment. From a home studio, my typical day consists of working to a deadline. This means that I am able to choose my own working hours which, although good, can lead to some late nights!



This course is for you if you are able to produce electronic music but need that helping hand in realising a career, building contacts and taking your work to the next level."

What tips would you give to someone wanting a career in your industry?

There are points in music where you sit in front of a blank screen or a piece of music that you don't like and want to tear your hair out. Being able to work through these moments is the key to creating the work that will help you progress in this industry.

Virtual DJ assessments

Final-year students on BA (Hons) Digital Music recently had the fantastic opportunity to take part in a totally unique end-of-year DJ assessment.

Instead of handing in the traditional audio mixtape project, students entered into a 'virtual' world, using a TV studio kitted out with a Mo-Sys camera tracking system which enabled tracking of the camera movements, with Unreal engine custom backgrounds – the kind of thing regularly seen on BBC News and the Olympic Games.

Supported by staff and students from television degrees, the team filmed the DJs in a greenscreen area in real time and projected them into a virtual space. Students then received a video file of themselves performing in the virtual world, which could then be used for their own promotion after completing their studies.

Steve Middleton, Technical Instructor for Audio and Music, said: "This unique opportunity enabled students to showcase their skills in an end-of-year assessment that was like nothing else we've done before. Being a DJ myself for many years, I feel this innovative project would give students confidence outside of their comfort zones, working in a multi disciplinary TV studio environment. We're really excited to continue building on this in future years."



Tell us a bit about your role and what a typical day looks like for you.

I look after the marketing activities for O2 Academy Bristol, O2 Academy Bournemouth and O2 Guildhall Southampton. Day-to-day I liaise with promoters on marketing plans and budgets, and action activities across both social media and classic marketing areas.

What do you enjoy most about your role, and what are the biggest challenges?

I love that I get to work with artists that I love and be a small part of putting the show on, and also that every day can be different, whether it be a venue/show day or an admin day of budgets. One challenge I have found is that our venues are not just music – they also cater for comedy and live podcast shows, to name a few. Therefore I have been learning lots about how different live events are promoted and the different audiences.

What's been your career highlight so far?

I've had a couple: in my old role at The Joiners we had Wolf Alice play and they are one of my all-time favourite bands – it was a very 'Wow, I'm actually doing this as my job now' moment. In this role – on a nostalgic note – my first ever gig was McFly when I was 11, and now I have just sold out three of their shows on the upcoming tour.




I think Solent helped me gain the confidence to put myself forward for things. When I started back in 2018 I never believed I would make it to where I am now, and a lot of that growth comes down to the wonderful support from the course team.

Favourite memory from your time at Solent?

On our course we had lots of opportunities to meet people from different sectors of the industry. I always loved guest talks, especially about the live and festival sector as that was my goal. What advice would you give to those wanting to follow in your footsteps?

Talk to everyone and make sure you get involved in things where you can! I remember in our first week someone saying 'the people around you will be your future colleagues', and it's so true. I know that it can be scary, but when it comes to confidence, fake it till you make it! Also, speak to the course team about any concerns you have – they offer great support!




How are your studies at Solent helping you prepare for your future career?

Abbey Road Studios - made famous by its namesake, the Beatles' Abbey Road album - has an unparalleled history of recording, and is still the facility of choice for many of the world's most celebrated artists, producers, composers and orchestras. It remains one of the most technically advanced recording and mixing facilities in the world, with wonderful acoustic spaces and a unique blend of vintage equipment and today's leading technology.

Students studying music are given the chance to visit and record at Abbey Road Studios as part of their degree course. Musicians then compete in front of a panel of judges for a chance to work in Studio 3 for a full day, supported by top in-house Abbey Road engineers.

BMus (Hons) Popular Music Performance alumna, Courtney Gray, who recently won the competition and recorded with her band Djuno, said of the experience: "The whole experience was really surreal. Being somewhere that so many influential people have been before and being lucky enough to be added to the list of people that have recorded there is amazing too."

Course Leader Toni Diaz adds: "The Abbey Road prize is a highlight of the year. Our students perform and record music in the most famous recording studio in the world. It is inspiring to see how the students elevate their work in such a prestigious environment."

Head Studio Engineer, Subfrantic Studios

BSc (Hons) Popular Music Production, 2020

Tell us a bit about your role and what a typical day looks like for you.

As head studio engineer I don't really have a typical day – it changes from day to day. I might be tracking artists, mixing or mastering, or fixing gear and maintaining the studios. It really varies, depending on what we have going on – which is why I love the job so much. The company I work for is also a live events production company, so I sometimes head out to gigs as an audio engineer or a drum tech.

What do you enjoy most about your role, and what are the biggest challenges?

What I enjoy most about my job is also its biggest challenge. Two days are very rarely the same. What two different artists want in a recording or mix will differ hugely, so every day tests your knowledge and skills, keeping you on your toes and always ready for the next curveball to be thrown. Luckily for me, I love learning new techniques and ways of approaching a problem. I'm also lucky enough to meet lots of new people in my job, which is something I enjoy a lot.

What's been your career highlight so far?

Most recently, recording the live tracks for Cat Burns' most recent tour with Sam Smith would definitely be a highlight. Having my recordings played at the O2 is incredible. Another huge highlight for me would be going on tour with Dave as a drum tech, working on his 2022 summer festival tour. Standing on the main stage at a headline performance at Reading Festival will be an experience I will never forget, as well as touring round the world to places such as Canada and Sweden.


What advice would you give to those wanting to follow in your footsteps?
