This series of workshops and seminars is designed for new and existing doctoral students. Some sessions may also be useful for early career researchers. The series will repeat in Jan-Mar 2019.

Milestones

Wed 17 Oct | 2pm - 4pm Research Launchpad (RM223) New and existing doctoral students are invited to an overview of the doctoral study milestones at Solent University, including planning, preparation, and how to make the most of your supervisory team's support at each stage.

Project and time management

Research integrity

DOCTORAL SUPERVISION TRAINING

Regulatory framework and standards

An overview of the 2018-19 regulations for PGR and the reporting structures of the University, this session will focus on the role and responsibilities of supervisors, and set these in the context of the national framework governing the provision of research degrees in the UK.

Admission and induction of PGR students

A review of the stages and timeframes of the PGR admissions process, this session will outline the information given to students in their institutional induction session and the areas that the supervisory team is expected to cover in their individual induction of PGR students.

Assessing training needs

This session will explore embedding a proactive approach to developing a tailored training programme for students at the formative stages of their project, and ensuring the students training needs are addressed throughout their programme of study

The session will outline the purpose and timeframes for the Project Approval and what actions the supervisor will need to undertake to prepare their student and arrange for the review.

Preparing for the Transfer and Annual Monitoring reviews

The session will review the procedural responsibilities of the supervisor in relation to key milestones. Supervisors will review the assessment criteria, think about how to prepare students to defend their work, and consider potential outcomes.

Preparing candidates for the PhD viva

This session will explore the supervisory team's role in preparation for the viva, and how supervisors can provide supportive and constructive guidance to students who do not meet the required standards.


The role of the Independent Chair and Examiner for PhDs

This session will provide an overview of the role of independent chairs of progression and viva panels. It will also review the role of examiners. The session will guide staff on how to ensure panels are conducted in a supportive and constructive way.

RESEARCH MENTORING

The Research Mentoring Scheme provides an excellent opportunity for both professional and personal development as either a mentor or mentee and is also a great way to network with other researchers around the University. The scheme is by lead by Professor Anthony Gallagher and facilitated through Research, Innovation and Enterprise (RIE). It will run as a pilot for the academic year 2018-19.



Why take part?

Participating in a mentoring scheme can help to enhance your career, broaden your thinking and support both your professional and personal development. Whether you choose to be mentor or a mentee, the scheme will give you a chance to enhance your research skills and meet like-minded individuals around the University.

How can I get involved?

To participate in the scheme as either a mentor or a mentee, please complete the relevant application form and email it to <u>bill.acharjee@solent.ac.uk</u>. Your form will then be assessed and a suitable match between mentor and mentee proposed.

Assuming the match is acceptable, then both mentors and mentees will be expected to engage in a short series of induction training events, as well as arranging four to six meetings over the period of the academic year. Some mentoring partners may be asked to take part in further evaluation activities, including creating suitable case studies for dissemination in future events.

RESEARCH EXCELLENCE FRAMEWORK 2021

The Research Excellence Framework (REF) is a peer review assessment of the quality of research in UK higher education institutions (HEIs). The review takes place every five to seven years. It is undertaken by the government's Higher Education Funding Councils. This series provides an introduction to the REF, explores Solent's plans for REF 2021, and provides information and training about submitting to the REF for academics who are on the research pathway. Introducing the Research Excellence Framework (REF)

Fri 19 Oct | 12:30pm - 1:30pm Research Launchpad (RM223)

This seminar is an introduction to REF2021 and will be especially relevant for early career researchers and interested doctoral students.

We will explore questions such as: What is the REF and why does it take place? Why might REF be important for your career? The session makes no assumption of prior knowledge, and looks at how you can build planning for REF into your career development.

Open access publishing for the REF

Wed 31 Oct | 12:30pm - 2:30pm | RM151 Participants in this workshop will use The Publishing Trap board game to explore the potential impacts of publishing choices and the role of open access. The session includes opportunity for discussion, and will signpost researchers toward online resources available to support dissemination and scholarly communication.

Solent and REF 2021
