I look forward to welcoming you to Southampton Solent University at an open day or other event, and I hope perhaps onto one of our courses very soon.



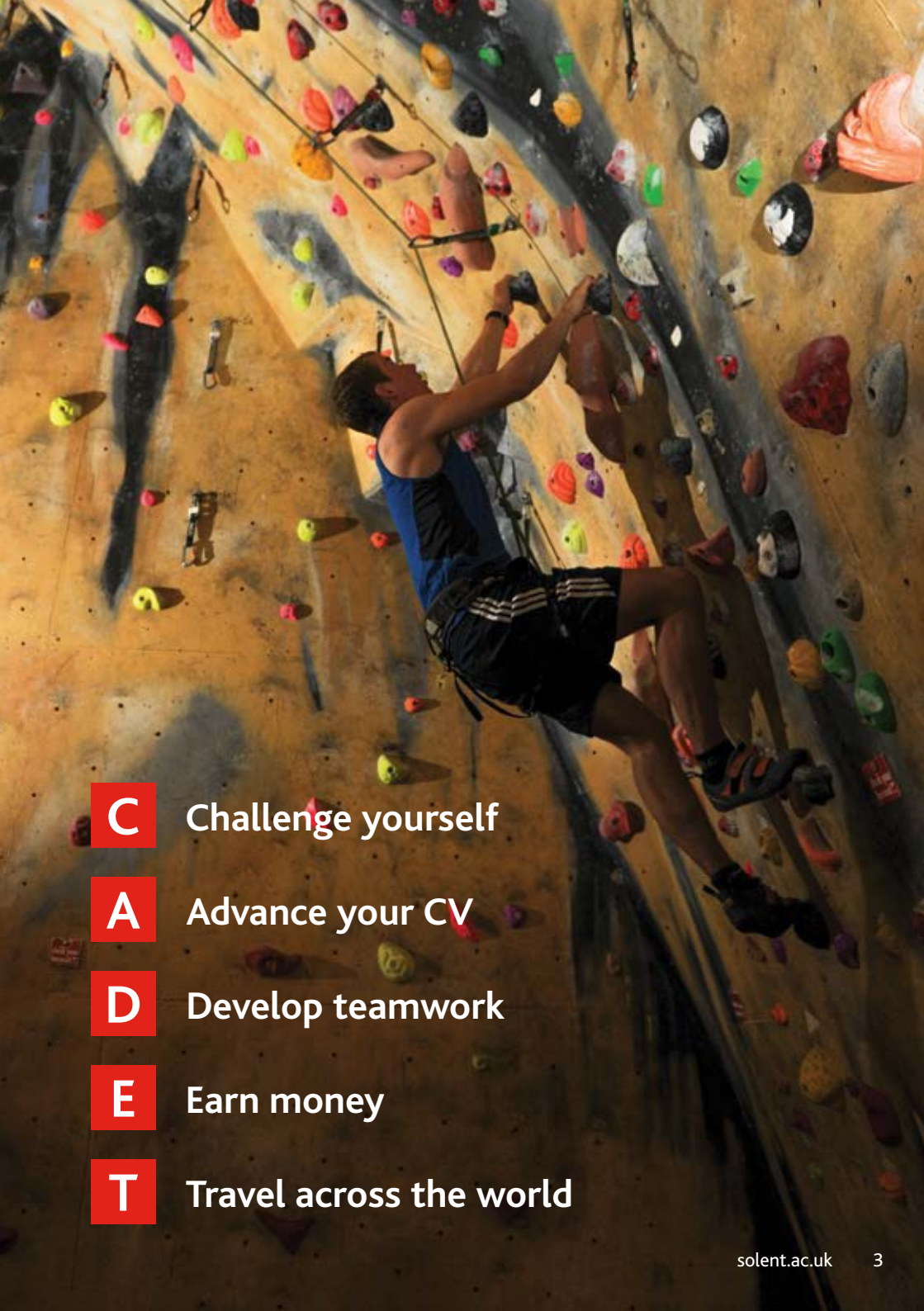

Entry requirements

The service units are open to first and second-year students. If you're interested in joining one of the units, you'll need to meet the entry requirements:

- You must be a British, Commonwealth or Republic of Ireland citizen.
- You must be over 18.

In joining a university service unit, there is no obligation to join your chosen service at the end of your studies and students cannot be deployed on operational duties.

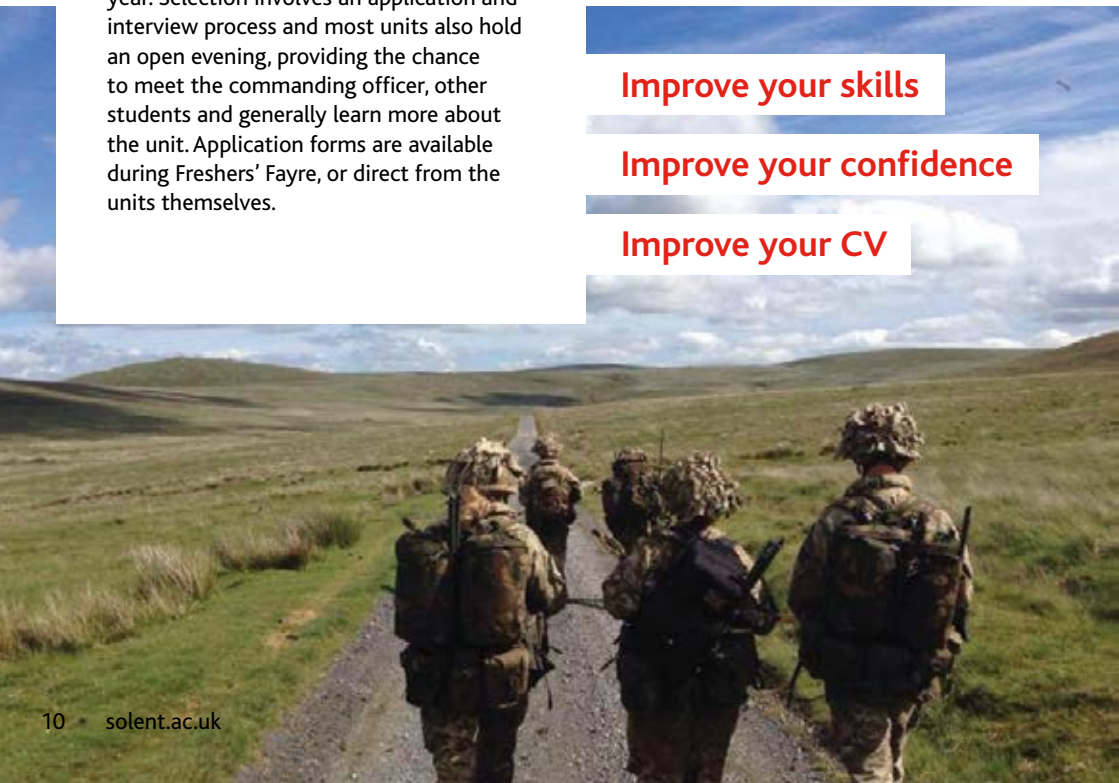
Each unit has a limited number of places and there is an annual intake of students, normally in September and October each year. Selection involves an application and interview process and most units also hold an open evening, providing the chance to meet the commanding officer, other students and generally learn more about the unit. Application forms are available during Freshers' Fayre, or direct from the units themselves.
